### What we do....

Platypus are one of the world's most unique animals, but, like many living creatures, they are under threat from human activity.

Platypus Education Group aims to inspire children to love and protect platypus through games, discussions, quizzes and more. We run incursions for students from Kinder, through Primary School and up to High School.



All our workshops are age-appropriate and are tailored to fit in with the Victorian State Curriculum. We work with each school to guarantee our incursions expand on what the students are already learning.

## Bringing the Creeks to the Classroom



#### Kinder - Year 2 60 minute Incursion - \$10 per student

Students discover what makes platypus such unique and interesting creatures. They also learn how they can protect them, with interactive games and demonstrations of real rubbish in our pretend creek.

#### Year 3 - Year 6

#### 90 minute Incursion - \$10 per student

A more detailed look at the life of the platypus - how long have they been around for? What type of mammal are they? What are their threats?

## Bringing the Creeks to the Classroom




#### Year 7 - 12

#### 90 - 120 minute Incursion - \$10 per student

Not only will the High School students learn about what makes platypus so unique, and how they can protect them; they will also be set a challenge - Create Your Own Campaign.

Can you organise a movement? Design a poster? Inspire the media? Go viral?

Using the information that PEG provides, the students will be taught how to engage an audience to help educate the community and sustain the local platypus populations.




# The Elastic Band Challenge

Each school has one month to take part in the challenge. Every band must be cut up and placed in the jar. The student / class / school that collects the most bands will win a prize!

We hope that this month-long challenge will turn into a lifetime habit; one that will protect not just platypus, but many, many other animals, birds and marine life.
